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MEMORY VERSE TOKENS

Duplicate the memory verse tokens (masters found on pages 17 and 18), making one token for each student in your class.

MEMORY VERSE POSTER

Enlarge and color the poster on page 19 or enlarge the poster on page 20 to use for teaching the memory verse.

STUDENT COLORING PAGES

Permission is granted to make one copy of pages 21 through 36 for each student in your class. For best results, set your copier to “text mode” and not “photo/grayscale mode” if this feature is available to you.

Lesson 1

THE PROMISE OF GOD

WORD STUDY: Omniscient

Prepare: Enlarge the illustration on page 4.

Discussion: *Omn* means *All*. Write *All* under it. *Sci-ent* looks much like the word science which means “having knowledge.” When we say that God is omniscient (pronounced om-nish-ent), we mean that God knows *all*. (See Lessons #3 and #4 for the other two attributes.)

MATCHING

Prepare: Print the following on a chalkboard or dry erase board:

Names for Jesus	God’s Enemy
Prophet	Son of God
Jesus	Angel
Satan	First Man and Woman
Bethlehem	Disobeying God
Adam & Eve	All-Knowing
Omniscience	One Who Accurately Predicts Future
Eternal	Jesus’ Birthplace
Creator	Jesus’ Mother
Mary	One Who Makes Everything out of Nothing
Sin	Having No Beginning or End
Gabriel	Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God
	Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace

Directions: Divide the class into two teams. Give each team a different color piece of chalk. Each team is to work as a group and decide which words they will try to match. To start, *Team A* picks an individual to match items on the list by drawing a line from the subject to the definition. If correct, the team receives two points. If incorrect, the team receives no points. Then *Team B* takes its turn and follows the same directions. Continue until all items are matched correctly.

Lesson 2

BIRTH OF THE LORD JESUS

SHOW AND TELL: Birth of the Lord Jesus

Materials Needed: Construction paper, glue.

Prepare: Copy the symbol in illustrations (found on pages 5-9) and glue onto construction paper for use during this review.

Directions: Show one symbol at a time as you mention each truth. Hand each symbol to a student after you talk about it, and have all stand in front of the room until all ten symbols are displayed.

Mary and Joseph had much to talk about as they traveled.

1. Scroll—They knew God’s Word and remembered His promises.
2. Virgin—Through Isaiah the prophet God promised His Son would be born of a virgin (Isaiah 7:14).
3. God also promised His Son would have glorious names:
 - a. Immanuel—God with us (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23).
 - b. Wonderful Counselor (that is, a Wonder of a Counselor—a person of two natures, God and Man).
 - c. The Mighty God.
 - d. The Everlasting (Eternal) Father.
 - e. The Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6).
4. Bethlehem—The prophet Micah wrote this promise of God: “My Son will be born in Bethlehem” (Micah 5:2).
5. Some months before Mary and Joseph were on their way to Bethlehem, God sent an angel to tell her she would have a Son whose name would be JESUS—The Son of God (Luke 1:31, 35).
6. An angel told Joseph that God’s Son would be named *Jesus*—“He shall save His people from their sins” (Matthew 1:21).

Mary and Joseph would have been filled with wonder as they talked about God’s promises, especially so since Mary doubtless repeated the angel’s assurance over and over again: “For with God nothing shall be impossible” (Luke 1:37).

Alternative Activity: Use a copier to make a set of the symbols for each student with one symbol and Scripture verse on each page. This can then be made into a mini take-home book.
