

These reproducible sheets are designed to help you as a storyteller. They do not take the place of the full text. Rather, in preparation to teach each story, read the full text carefully until you are familiar with it. Then use the key word sheets as a quick reference while telling the story to your group. So that you can use these sheets multiple times, you might place them back-to-back in clear plastic page protectors.

Since this story is being told in the first person by the character, Ruth, we have highlighted the words in which she is speaking aloud.
